Connecticut Case Law

- Auster v. Norwalk United Methodist Church, 286
 Conn. 152, 943 A.2d 391 (2008). The plaintiff
 commenced this action against the defendant
 seeking damages under the dog bite statute,
 General Statutes Sec. 22-357, pursuant to
 which an owner or keeper of a dog is strictly
 liable for any damage caused by the dog to the
 person or property of another. Specifically, the
 plaintiff sought to recover damages from the
 defendant as a keeper of the dog under Sec.
 22-357.
- <u>Graff v. Zoning Board of Appeals</u>, 277 Conn. 645 (2006)
 Restricting number of dogs on residential property.
