TITLE 36 FISH AND GAME

CHAPTER 4
LICENSES TO HUNT, FISH AND TRAP

6-409. GAME TAGS -- PERMITS -- FEES -- PENALTY. (a) Resident Game A resident who has obtained authorization to hunt, as provided in in 36-401, Idaho Code, or has purchased or obtained a license to hunt, pivided in section 36-406, Idaho Code, upon payment of the fees provided in shall be eligible to receive a resident game tag to hunt and kill a bighorn sheep, mountain goat, elk, deer, antelope, mountain lion, wolf, sandhill crane or turkey in accordance with the laws of this and rules promulgated by the commission; provided further, that any who holds a senior resident combination license or any person who a junior combination or hunting license or any disabled American who holds a disabled combination license, may be issued a bear, deer, or turkey tag for a fee as specified in section 36-416, Idaho Code; led further, that resident game tags may be issued only to those persons meet residency requirements of subsection (s) of section 36-202, Idaho. In the event an emergency is declared to open a season to protect the property as provided in section 36-106(e)6.(B), Idaho Code, the ted landowner or his designee shall be eligible to receive a resident tags may be issued only to persons who qualify as residents pursuant to be 36-202, Idaho Code.

(b) Nonresident Game Tags. A nonresident who has purchased a license to as provided in section 36-407(a) or (k), Idaho Code, or has obtained a set o hunt, as provided in section 36-406(e), Idaho Code, or a resident as purchased or obtained a license or authorization to hunt, as provided ection 36-401 or 36-406, Idaho Code, upon payment of the fees provided in, shall be eligible to receive a nonresident tag to hunt and kill a bighorn sheep, mountain goat, elk, deer, antelope, mountain lion, wolf, sandhill crane or turkey in accordance with the laws of this and rules promulgated by the commission; provided further, that a sident who has purchased a license to hunt, as provided in section 36-416. Idaho Code, shall be eligible to receive a junior mentored deer, elk, or turkey tag for a fee as specified in section 36-416. Idaho Code

c) Game Tags Required. The appropriate tag must be had for the hunting aking of each and every one of the aforementioned wildlife. The ssion shall promulgate rules to allow exception from tag possession to wildlife for a disabled hunter companion who is assisting a hunter ssing the appropriate tag and a valid disabled combination license or a led archery permit or a disabled hunt motor vehicle permit or who is a led veteran participating in a hunt as provided in section 36-408(7), Code. Provided, however, that the requirements for a wolf tag, a ain lion tag or a bear tag, as to different periods of time and areas of tate, shall be determined and specified by the commission. Provided er, that the commission may promulgate rules to allow a nonresident deer tag to be used to hunt and kill either a bear, wolf or a mountain lion g the open season for deer or elk in that area, unit or zone as may be fied by the commission. (d) Game Tag to Be Validated and Attached to Carcass. As soon as any son kills any wildlife for which a tag is required, said tag, belonging to must be validated and attached to said wildlife in a manner provided by mission rule.

e) Archery Permits. In addition to meeting the license and tag rements provided in this chapter, any person participating in any polled or general game season which has been specifically designated as thery hunt must have in his possession an archery hunt permit, which may rechased for a fee as specified in section 36-416, Idaho Code.

f) Muzzleloader Permit. In addition to meeting the license and tag rements provided in this chapter, any person participating in any olled or general game season which has been specifically designated as a eloader hunt must have in his possession a muzzleloader permit, which purchased for a fee as specified in section 36-416, Idaho Code.

(g) Hound Hunter Permit -- Resident -- Nonresident. Any person using a for the purpose of hunting or for taking, as defined in section 36-202, Code, big game or furbearing animals must have in his possession a hound hunter permit, which may be purchased by resident and nonresident se holders for a fee as specified in section 36-416, Idaho Code.

h) Nonresident Bird of Prey Capture Permit. The commission may, under as it may prescribe, issue a nonresident bird of prey capture permit. capture permit may be purchased by any licensed, nonresident falconer apturing birds of prey in Idaho. The fee for the permit shall be as fied in section 36-416, Idaho Code, and the permit shall be issued under ondition that the nonresident's home state allows reciprocal raptor ring privileges for Idaho falconers.

i) Wildlife Management Area (WMA) Upland Game Bird Permit. The ssion may, under rules as it may prescribe, issue a wildlife management

area upland game bird permit that must be purchased by all persons over acventeen (17) years of age prior to hunting stocked upland game birds on state wildlife management areas designated by the commission. The fee for the permit shall be as specified in section 36-416, Idaho Code.

j) Bear Baiting Permit. The commission may, under rules as it may prescribe, issue a bear baiting permit. Any person placing or using bait as may be allowed by rule for the purpose of attracting bear must have in his possession a valid bear baiting permit, which may be purchased by a license holder for a fee as specified in section 36-416, Idaho Code.

k) Migratory Bird Harvest Information Program Permit. The commission may, as provided by federal laws or regulations and under rules as it may prescribe, issue a migratory bird harvest information program permit that must be purchased by all persons prior to hunting migratory game birds as required by federal law or regulations. The fee for the permit shall be as specified in section 36-416, Idaho Code.

1) Dog Field Trial Permit. The commission may, under rules as it may ribe, issue a dog field trial permit to any person using birds for dog trials or training as may be allowed by rule. The permit may be hased for a fee as specified in section 36-416, Idaho Code.

m) Idaho Nursing Home Facility Resident Fishing Permit. The commission under rules as it may prescribe, issue an Idaho nursing home facility ent fishing permit that must be purchased by an Idaho nursing home ty to allow residents of its facility to fish during the open season. ities eligible to purchase this permit are: intermediate care facilities ling twenty-four (24) hour skilled nursing care, assisted living ties providing twenty-four (24) hour extensive assistance, and skilled a facilities providing twenty-four (24) hour skilled nursing. By asing this permit the facility assumes full responsibility for and ol over the facility residents while using the permit. All laws, rules proclamations apply to the use of this permit and it is the sibility of the facility to assure compliance with all laws, rules and mations. In case of a violation the facility shall be held accountable my citations shall be issued to the facility. The permit may be ased for a fee as specified in section 36-416, Idaho Code.
